The Board of Trustees has approved the appointment of Dr. Deonia Simmons as Denmark-Olar High School principal, effective July 1, 2018. This appointment follows a search that began when Mr. Mickey Pringle announced his intention to retire after eleven years at the high school, having served as assistant principal and principal. The Board remains grateful for the leadership and contributions made by Mr. Pringle.

Dr. Simmons is a 1988 graduate of Denmark-Olar High School. He earned his Bachelor's Degree in Biology from Voorhees College and his Master's Degree in Educational Leadership and his Doctoral Degree in Organizational Leadership from Nova Southeastern University of Fort Lauderdale, Florida.

Dr. Simmons currently serves as Principal at Kingstree Senior High School in Kingstree, South Carolina. In his new role as principal at Denmark-Olar High School, Dr. Simmons envisions his responsibilities to include, but not be limited to, providing effective, consistent and visible leadership for all staff and students; supporting educators in examining pedagogical practices and analyzing student data to enhance teaching effectiveness; overseeing the efficient operation of each facet of the high school, including non-academic services; hiring, coaching and evaluating education-professionals; providing education-professionals with support in analyzing and using student academic performance data to tailor instructional practices; and ensuring site compliance with all regulatory and legal requirements governing the school and its staff.

Along with the excitement of coming home, Dr. Simmons says that he accepted the principal's position at Denmark-Olar High School because the position affords him the opportunity to use his various school and district level administrative

experiences to make a positive difference in the lives of this country's greatest resource – our children. Dr. Simmons' vision for Denmark-Olar High School is to make it one of the premier high schools in the state of South Carolina.
