DOES PARENTING MEETING

On Thursday, December 6, DOES held a parent forum. Parents met to learn more about South Carolina's Read to Succeed Law that mandates third grade retention for students who don't meet state test requirements in reading. Dr. Peeples began the meeting by reminding parents that DOES is a Title 1 school that utilizes funds to close the achievement gap by providing student support services, instructional enhancement, professional development opportunities, and

parenting sessions. Afterwards, parents were presented the school's academic profile, how it is determined, and how the school determines and addresses academic goals. The school's report card rating was presented. The rated areas were discussed. Much emphasis was placed on the SC Ready results for math and ELA. Parents were presented with sample results, shown how to read it, and shown how results impact overall school ratings. The results from 2017 - 2018 are directly related to the instruction that is provided in 2018 – 2019.

Dr. Peeples used MAP and TE21 score reports to explain how benchmark data is used to drive instruction. Parents walked through each report to determine the standards that are assessed, the student's score, and how that score is used to predict a child's performance on the state's assessment. Sample reading passages and mathematics items were presented to parents to help parents realize the academic rigor of the tests and the amount of knowledge and stamina a child needs in order to be successful. The good cause exemption clause was explained and parents asked pertinent questions.

DOES extends a special thanks to all parents who attended. Parents' feedback is welcomed because it ensures that the school is moving in a positive direction.
