Project STREAM 2018

Project STREAM, the 21st Century after school program, began on Tuesday, September 18th. Over 135 students registered for the program, and unfortunately, some are still waiting for an opportunity to participate. Students engage in academic enrichment that assists them with homework and classroom success. They explore special interests by participating in chorus, dance, arts and crafts, brain teaser, food and nutrition, and physical activities.

Students' STEM experiences include farming, aerodynamics, and cyber security. Students extend their experiences beyond the classroom as they travel to various learning venues, and periodically, field experiences are brought to them. OBAP ATLANTA ACE ACADEMY



Last Summer, Eidref Siblag, a Denmark-Olar High School student, participated in the Atlanta Aviation Career Education (ACE) Academy sponsored by the Organization of Black Aerospace Professionals (OBAP). Eidref's participation in the week-long camp was sponsored by Captain Ron Graves, a pilot for United Airlines, and alumni of DOHS class of 1978.



OBAP's ACE Academy provides middle and high school youth with exposure to opportunities in aerospace and aviation through week-long summer camps. All participants explored aviation history and got the opportunity to actually fly a single engine airplane. Also, the participants took a flight on an Airbus A-321, from Atlanta to Dayton, OH, where they spent the day at the US Air Force museum. Captain Ron Graves will take four students from Denmark Olar High School to the Atlanta ACE camp in the summer of 2019.

DOHS Seniors Starting Early & Finishing Strong

Throughout August-December, high schools across the state will host College Application Day events to assist students

with the college application process. The goal of College Application Month is to provide a forum for all South Carolina seniors to complete and file college applications. Much of the focus of College Application Month is geared toward first-generation college students and students who may not otherwise apply to college.

At DOHS, we included events for freshmen, sophomores and juniors. Freshmen were engaged in "Opportunity Orientation," facilitated by Stephen Mason, VP of Economic and Workforce Development at Denmark Technical College. In this session students were informed of the myriad of opportunities available to them. Sophomores participated in a "Sophomore Soft Skills" session conducted by Marilyn Pickering, our Regional Career Specialist. "Junior Jumpstart" has become an annual addition to College Application Day where the college recruiters form a panel and answer questions posed by a moderator as well as the students in the audience. The staff are in on it as well, wearing their college paraphernalia and taking ten minutes of each class period to talk about the college experience. Our seniors completed or at least started close to 200 applications at this year's event!

This year we have added The College Goal South Carolina event. College Goal South Carolina, held on October 8, is an opportunity for ALL students, parents and guardians to receive free financial aid assistance while completing and submitting the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). The FAFSA is the first step to receiving Federal aid and the second step to post-secondary access. It is a vital requirement for most college students who plan to pay for college with the assistance of several different types of aids.

So, the two most important things needed to transition to college - completing applications and the FAFSA have been started early and we are excited to see the Class of 2019 finish strong!

A thousand of South Carolina's most promising rising seniors were nominated by their

schools to attend the South Carolina Palmetto Boys State (PBS) event in SC. Palmetto Boys State is a "governmental laboratory" for leaders from high schools across the state and the attendees divide into mock cities and counties and mirror the state legislature.

Our own Talance Holman represented Denmark-Olar High School in this conglomeration of future leaders. Here are excerpts from his personal account of his experience:

My experience at PBS was absolutely amazing! The brotherhood at Anderson University was as if we knew each other for many years. We still actually have a group chat with our counselors who are, surprisingly, just a little older than I am. The leadership qualities that are expected there are held to a high standard. One of the mottos of Boys State often quoted is, "This is not a game or democracy at Boys State."

I was a part of a group called the Federalists and we opposed the Nationalists or Nats for short. We were then assigned to certain cities. I was assigned to Savannah and there were more than 40 others in my city. We had a stupendous amount of fun. We

played basketball, soccer, track...you name it. I made many friends and rivals at Boys State. A part of our evening rituals included certain battle chants. I led a chant entitled, "Who's that Chanting?"

Our junior and senior counselors, Nolan Henderson, Trevor Mudden and Furman Wilson, pushed us to run for almost every office. I ran for city councilman at large and the highest office at Boys State...Governor.

There are so many people I want to thank for helping me to realize this goal. I would like to thank the DOHS Guidance Department and Mr. Fulda for helping me through the application process. Shout out to all of the brotherhood who helped to make this experience rewarding.

My experience was almost movie-like in that I went into the experience one way and it changed my perspective and helped me to see how large the world is but how much people from every pathway of life can have in common. 

2017 South Carolina Teen Birth Trends

South Carolina's teen birth rate has declined by 70% since peaking in 1991, continuing decades of success for communities across the state. This includes a 9% decrease from 2016 to 2017, landing the teen birth rate for 15-19 year olds at 21.7 per 1,000 females. Declines over the past 25 years have been most substantial among African American youth ages 15-17 whose teen birth rate has decreased by 83% since 1991.

Older youth (18-19 year olds) continue to drive the overall South Carolina teen birth rate, currently making up 75% of all teen births. The South Carolina Campaign to Prevent Teen Pregnancy (SC Campaign) cannot make an impact on teen pregnancy rates without teams of dedicated professionals willing to engage young people across the state. The SC Campaign is committed to supporting professionals and parents, making sure South Carolina's youth get effective health education and increased access to reproductive health services.
