The Choice Bus is an experience-based learning tool designed to show young people the power of education, as well as, the likely consequences of choosing to drop out of school.

The Choice Bus contains a full scale replica of a prison cell which is hidden behind a curtain and flat screen television. Upon entering the bus, a four-minute movie will quiz the audience on the earning potential of a dropout versus a high school and college graduate.

The movie also features several powerful testimonials from people who regret dropping out - prison inmates. When the movie is

finished, the cell is revealed demonstrating the stark reality experienced by many dropouts. Students are then invited into the prison cell to briefly experience the uncomfortable living conditions.

As students exit the bus, they receive a pledge card and are asked to make a commitment to finish school and make good choices. The Choice Bus experience is approximately twenty minutes long and is designed for grades 6-10.

The Choice Bus is sponsored by The Mattie C. Stewart Foundation, a non-profit organization committed to increasing the high school graduation rate. They work diligently to educate, engage, and equip students with tools to impart the importance of obtaining an education. her son Samuel's idea that we can all make a difference, The Foundation is dedicated to reducing the national dropout rate. In creating

tools and resources for educators, community leaders and parents. The Mattie C. Stewart Foundation has developed innovative strategies to more effectively address this issue.

The dropout rate in the U.S. is a national crisis, requiring unconventional approaches for reaching our youth. The Foundation has earned nationwide respect for breakthrough endeavors such as The Choice Bus and the Inside Out documentary. These projects show the dedication of The Foundation to take a unique approach in order to reduce the dropout rate. The Mattie C. Stewart Foundation is committed to working with others to produce the tools and resources that promote graduation.

The Choice Bus visited the middle and high schools recently. A total of 312 students participated in the activity.

Child Find is a component of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) that requires states to identify, locate, and evaluate children with disabilities, ages 3-21, regardless of the severity of their disabilities, who may be in need of special education services.

- Vision
- Motor Skills

- Daily Living Skills

DOHS CHESS & DEBATE CLUB PROVIDE CRAFT KITS

DOHS's Chess and Debate Club put together craft kits for in-patient youth during the December meeting. These will be distributed to the Orangeburg RMC and MUSC Children's Hospital. Kit creations were of snowmen/women heads with hats that are made from tongue depressors/craft sticks and other assorted items. They also made ginger bread men/women kits and included color construction paper blanks for creating embellishments on them.

Other kits were made using white paper lunch bags. These kits enable the youth to make a polar bear puppet with pompoms and pipe cleaners to simulate ear muffs as well as items to customize their puppets and make mittens, hats, scarves, etc. All kits included instructions with a picture of a completed item as well as additional items and suggestions for customization. Pupils decided to make most of the craft kits with no holiday theme as the hospitals will be able to be use them throughout the entire winter.
