FIRE SAFETY

Each year thousands of people die or lose their home to fires. "Research shows that having working smoke alarms can cut the risks of dying in a fire almost half." Fortunately, our second and third graders, thanks to a FEMA grant, have the opportunity to participate in Sound Off with the Home Fire Safety Patrol, a fire safety program for children and their families. The

grant allows local fire departments to work with elementary schools to deliver lifesaving lessons about the danger of smoke and how smoke alarms keep us safe. Students and their families will test fire alarms, learn how to prevent fires, and devise a plan in case of a home fire. Families will have the opportunity to receive smoke alarms for their homes, have a home safety visit, and receive a review of their fire safety plan. The students are enjoying the inquiry into the dangers of smoke and the lifesaving benefits of smoke detectors and safety plans.



We would like to thank Dr. Anna Martin and the Lions club for conducting vision screenings for our students. All students who obtained parental consent were screened. Students needing follow-up care received parent notifications.



We will have our annual Black History program on Thursday, February 27. The theme for this year's program is:




Come out and help us celebrate the legacy.

The eighth grade students at D-O Middle School had their job shadow opportunity on Tuesday, February 11th and the high school students, grades 9th through 12th had an opportunity between Monday, February 3rd and Friday, February 14th to do a one-day job shadow experience and oh the places they went. Approximately 19% of the students eligible to participate in a job shadow experience did so.

Job shadowing in Denmark-Olar School District Two is always an anticipated time among students. It's an opportunity for them to "try on" a career for a day and see whether or not it's a good fit Our students have shadowed varied jobs, IT professionals, engineers, truck drivers, veterinarians, teachers, cafeteria workers, retail workers, football and basketball coaches, a judge and more. Students turned in their consent form and the Career Specialist, Ms. Zelda Douglas, confirmed the information and provided them with a packet to be completed and a packet to give to their job shadow host.

Job shadowing is a very enriching experience. You get valuable insight into the world of work. Students are exposed to adults that are engaged in their chosen field who often serve as mentors and they get feedback, overwhelmingly positive, regarding their soft skills. Ms. Douglas said, "The fact that our students go out and receive compliments on their behavior is no shock to me. It's one of the advantages to living in a small town like Denmark. Good manners are still encouraged and expected. We work on skills like correctly shaking hands, providing eye

contact, posture, what not to wear, and being accountable, among other things, but the core of who they are, who their parents are raising them to be cannot be perfected in a session or two. So, I am glad to work hard toward this goal because the experience not only gives the students a memorable impact but it tends to give the professionals that host them some hope that there are great students out there with great promise."

PARENTS' RIGHT TO KNOW

In compliance with the requirements of the Every Student Succeeds Act, Bamberg School District Two would like to inform you that you may request information about the professional qualifications of your student's teacher(s) and/or paraprofessional(s). The following information may be requested:

- Whether the student's teacher
- *has met State qualifications and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction;
- *is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which State qualifications or licensing criteria have been waived; and
- *is teaching in the field of discipline of the certification of the teacher.
- Whether the child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications.

If you wish to request information concerning your child's teacher's and/or paraprofessional's qualifications, please contact your child's principal.
